# Welcome

Welcome to the inaugural "The State of Bipartisanship" report produced by Majority in the Middle.

Majority in the Middle is a 501(c)3 non-profit organization giving those in the political middle a place to gather outside the extremes, elevating voices of people who are modeling behavior we want to see, and working on ways to bring a little more civility and a little less partisanship to our politics.

Majority in the Middle works to elevate elected representatives who embrace working with others to find solutions, and to identify and encourage structural changes in governing that will remove barriers to such cooperation.

Understanding that you can't manage what you don't measure, this report is designed to analyze bipartisan bill authorship as one important reflection of effective collaboration. This effort will begin identifying places where cooperation happens, elevating the people who are leading the way, and collecting replicable ideas to cultivate a healthier political environment -- in St. Paul and in state capitols across the country.

Note: this report has been edited since it's initial publication.

In December 2023, an addendum was included into the report. Pages 114-315 illustrate the same legislator data presented on pages 78-108 in an individual format, instead of as an aggregate. The data is the same - the only change is the format.

# **Executive Summary**

In the current political environment, everywhere from DC to state capitols across the country, bipartisanship is rarely on display.

Binary red-vs-blue narratives lead Minnesotans to believe that legislators are irreparably segregated along party lines. This report shows that's not entirely true.

Bipartisanship is difficult to measure, as it's highly qualitative, subjective, and relationship-based. We have chosen one quantitative measure we believe provides an illustration of some of the work that goes on at the State Capitol: bill authorship.

Legislators who are collaborating with colleagues across the aisle should get credit for the work they're doing. This report, a first of its kind in Minnesota, uncovers where that credit is due.

Even though some lawmakers actually face backlash over their bipartisan work, we know there are many constituents who not only applaud those efforts, they expect it.

The bottom line: there is some bipartisanship at work in Minnesota, and there is room for improvement.

# Introduction and Background



# Bipartisanship is difficult - in theory and in execution

In the current political environment, everywhere from DC to state capitols across the country, bipartisanship is rarely on display.

The prevailing binary left-versus-right narrative has been adopted by everyone from news media and political analysts to campaign managers and candidates.

This lack of bipartisanship can be seen as the most obvious example of the harms caused when elected officials can't set aside differences of any kind in order to focus on the well-being of the communities and people they represent.

It seems we are a country divided, and everyone participating in our politics has become irreparably partisan. Or have they?

Experience tells us bipartisanship is punished as often as it's lauded. Much like good sportsmanship, bipartisanship is an attitude that Americans value - but often only in theory, and not nearly as much as we value winning.

But winning a campaign and governing are two different functions of politics. Governing is where politicians should put aside differences and focus on working with their colleagues to serve the people they represent. We wish it were as easy in practice as it sounds, and we also acknowledge that legislators do face structural impediments to working across the aisle.

# Minnesota state government is an ideal subject for a study of bipartisanship

In Minnesota, majorities in the House and Senate, and the occupant of the Governor's office, have been held by members of different parties in all but three of the last 30\* years.

This split control of government is a recipe for forced bipartisanship - every idea that becomes law must be vetted and approved by more than one party. While it might be more frustrating for politicians, it is a more accurate representation of how every other worker in the state must approach their job.

The capitol is the only workplace where actively discounting the opinions of co-workers that belong to a different political party is accepted as normal operating procedure. We know this is common practice, and it is also true that not all legislators operate that way.

# A Trifecta in 2023

Minnesota lawmakers headed into the 2023 session with a DFL\* trifecta -- the Governor and both legislative majorities -- giving rise to questions about how the session would function.

When one party has enough members to pass most bills without a single vote from the opposite side of the aisle, and with Minnesota's winner-take-all legislative structure that guarantees absolute control with the narrowest of margins, could bipartisanship even happen?

For years, legislators representing the two major parties had something in common: no matter which side was in the minority, the common complaint was that they were not allowed to participate in policymaking in a meaningful way.

Members of the majority usually fill all the leadership roles, they hold an oversized proportion of seats on committees, and they decide the agenda - including which bills are heard publicly\*\* or not. For all practical purposes, the most significant negotiations are conducted and decisions are made in the majority's caucus room.

Bipartisan participation and the role the minority plays in that process is often difficult to pin down. Some believe the role of the minority party is to obstruct progress and the majority party has no obligation to involve the minority party. Others believe members of the majority and minority parties, both, should be involved in crafting legislation and reflecting the opinions of all the people they represent.

For bipartisanship to work in a legislature, the majority caucus needs to make space for minority participation, and the minority party needs to take the opportunity to work together. Both parties must come to the table in good faith. Unfortunately, this seems to happen less than it ideally would.

Bipartisanship is difficult to measure. Like other concepts that are highly relationship-based, it is complicated and subjective. Bipartisanship can be about something as personal as tone, or something as organizational as sharing power. The same person acting in a bipartisan manner in one context, and completely partisan in another - often on the same day, or in the same meeting - would not be unusual at the capitol.

# Bipartisanship is nuanced

We wanted to answer the question: "Can members of the minority party actually get bills heard?

Throughout our information-gathering, other questions popped up; we realized that instead of just answering a yesor-no question, more nuance and information should be included. This led us to a different way to evaluate individual bills.

To illustrate the *total authorship* of bills, we created two graphs for each committee: one showing bill hearings classified by the party affiliation of the chief author - red or blue - and one showing the same bills that takes total authorship into account.

As you'll see, including shades of purple to represent the proportions of red *and* blue authors paints a very different picture. We believe it is a better illustration of the influence and participation by members of each of the political parties - especially when, in this era of omnibus bills - the red-blue divide is often more stark when it comes to final votes.

# Why we created this report

Surfacing hidden bipartisanship and elevating examples of bipartisan behavior are part of the organizational mission of Majority in the Middle.

It's a fact that the cooperation and collaboration happening at the capitol doesn't often get public attention - the fight does. Dueling talking points, outrageous floor speeches and social media skirmishes get much more attention than policy and relationships. As an organization, we'll do what we can to shine more light on the bipartisanship that is happening.

An ugly truth we contend with: not every legislator wants attention for their bipartisan work and not every legislator would find bipartisanship to be an electoral benefit in their district.

We would argue that any bipartisanship, no matter how small, is still important. Why? Every legislator, even those who run unopposed, have people in their district who didn't vote for them. Representing all the citizens in the district, not just the ones who voted in favor of them, is their duty.

# What this report is not

Although comparisons will naturally occur, this report is not an effort to shame, or to adjudicate who is best or worst.

Bipartisanship is complicated. Bill authorship is just one measure. As authoring public policy is an essential part of every legislator's job, it is an important measure.

There are many ways a legislator can work across the aisle that are not captured in this report. The omission of other measures should not reflect the value of that work as lesser or not important. It is our position that any efforts by legislators to cross the aisle and build relationships should be celebrated.

It was our desire to ensure this report is objective and defendable, so efforts that are more subjectively measured were not included. We are exploring opportunities to expand the scope of the report in future years and will do so if resources allow.

# Can members of the minority party get their bills heard?

In a word, yes, but that yes comes with nuance. In the 2023 legislative session....

- There were 3,363 bills introduced in the Senate, and hearings were granted to 289 bills by Republican chief authors. Bills chief-authored by a member of the minority party represented 19% of the bills heard in the Senate.
- There were 3,342 bills introduced in the House, and hearings were granted to 145 bills by Republican chief authors. Bills chief-authored by a member of the minority party represented 11% of the bills heard in the House.

# **Total Bill Introductions & Hearings**

#### Minnesota Senate

3,363 bills were introduced.

- 2,109 (63%) bills had a chief author from the majority party, and
- 1,255 (37%) bills had a chief author from the minority party.

1,494 of those bills received one or more hearings in a committee

- 1,206 (81%) had a chief author from the majority party, and
- 289 (19%) had a chief author from the minority party.


#### **Minnesota House of Representatives**

3,342 bills were introduced.

- 2,140 (64%) bills had a chief author from the majority party, and
- 1,202 (36%) bills had a chief author from the minority party.

1,321 of those bills received one or more hearings in a committee

- 1,176 (89%) had a chief author from the majority party, and
- 145 (11%) had a chief author from the minority party.



# Partisan Breakdown of Bills Introduced

#### **Minnesota Senate**

3,363 bills were introduced.

• 1,349 bills were authored by only one member (639 by a sole Republican; 710 by a sole DFLer)

#### Of the bills with two or more authors:

- 768 bills (38%) had 100% majority authorship,
- 339 bills (17%) had 100% minority authorship, and
- 908 bills (45%) that were heard had at least one author of each party.


#### **Minnesota House of Representatives**

3,342 bills were introduced.

• 1,089 bills were authored by only one member (579 by a sole Republican; 510 by a sole DFLer)

#### Of the bills with two or more authors:

- 1,176 bills (52%) had 100% majority authorship,
- 470 bills (21%) had 100% minority authorship, and
- 607 bills (27%) that were heard had at least one author of each party.

# **Committee Hearings**


This section of the report examines the authorship of bills that received a hearing in a committee during the 2023 regular session.

When a bill is labeled as DFL or Republican based on the party identity of the chief author, a binary picture emerges. But bills in Minnesota have more participation beyond the chief author. A Senate bill can have up to five total authors, a House bill can have up to thirty-five. Party affiliation of the co-authors matters as well, because a minority member is unlikely to put their name on a bill they – and their constituents – would see as "too extreme."


To illustrate total authorship, we created two graphs for each committee: one showing bill hearings classified by the party affiliation of the chief author - red or blue - and one showing the same bills, with total authorship taken into account.

As you'll see, including shades of purple to represent the proportions of red *and* blue authors paints a very different picture. We believe it is a better illustration of the influence and participation by members of each of the political parties - especially when, in this era of omnibus bills - the red-blue divide is often more stark when it comes to final votes.

# Individual Legislators



# How do individual legislators influence bipartisanship?

Unlike most roles at the legislature that are based on seniority and hierarchy, individual legislators have enormous agency and power to create and cultivate bipartisan support for bills.

They do this by actively including colleagues across the aisle on their own bills, as well as signing on to bills authored by others.

These connections may be built on shared interests, from practical similarities of districts (e.g., shared county or school districts, similar industrial base) to personal (relationships, similar personal or family stories, professional interests, legislative interests). Based on these commonalities, members can actively work to build these connections and collaborate on legislation.

Ultimately, legislators are free agents with election certificates.

Ideally, individuals will recognize and use that agency to build trust within their caucus while also building and nurturing relationships across the aisle - as well as down the hallway with members the other legislative body. Every bill in the House needs a Senate companion and vice versa, so bicameral relationships are important.

Members who serve in the 17 "split" senate districts -- where the Representative and Senator are of different parties -- have a built-in opportunity to create bicameral bipartisan relationships just by working on legislation that affects their district.

## Senate and House: not equal playing fields

There are key structural realities between the two bodies in the Minnesota legislature that may contribute to partisan differences.

The Senate is a smaller group of people (67 versus 134), which makes the Senate a bit more personal. With fewer colleagues in total, it can be harder to dismiss others on a purely partisan basis.

Members of the House of Representatives are elected every two years, while Senators are on a 4-4-2 cycle.\*

The consistent two-year election cycle may lead House members to be in perpetual campaign mode, feeling pushed to seek media coverage, and/or to be more extreme in policies, statements and social media.

For this reason, it's important for constituents who care about cooperation and collaboration to regularly engage with their elected officials to communicate those values.

\*In election years ending in 0, Senators serve for a two-year term to accommodate the redistricting process done in conjunction with the decennial census.

## Outside factors also shape bill authorship

While legislators have some agency and choice in which bills to carry or sign onto, there are additional outside factors that influence the partisan makeup of bill authors/co-authors.

Local projects, particularly those that have to do with infrastructure needs, are often non/bipartisan. The party makeup of the delegation that represents that area can influence the partisanship of the bill. For instance, communities represented entirely by members of the same party will have that reflected in more seemingly partisan bills. In split districts, the opposite might be true.

Bills being driven by individuals or groups outside the legislature are typically first "shopped" to members of the majority for chief authorship.

### Bill authorship by individual legislators

For each member of the legislature, we did two calculations.

First, the proportion of co-authors from either party included on bills for which legislators are chief author\*, and therefore in charge of.

Second, how frequently legislators signed onto bills as a co-author that were carried by members of their own party versus those bills carried by members across the aisle.

The individual information is presented as a percentage, instead of by a numerical count. Different legislators have different preferences on the number of bills they carry and/or sign onto, and sometimes their bill load is affected by other roles in the legislature.

As a reminder, it is our position that bipartisan cooperation is nuanced, and bill authorship is just one piece. There are many ways a legislator can work across the aisle that are not captured in this report.

\*Our analysis subtracted out bills for which the legislator was the sole author. Including party identification for those bills seemed to paint an overly partisan picture of the entire dataset. Those bills are still included, but show as grey, instead of red, blue, or purple.
























































# Bills Heard vs. Bills Passed

There are two major questions that will likely be raised that we're not able to answer in this report: how the number of bills that received hearings compares to prior years, and what percentage of bills heard were enacted.

We consider this report as the start of a project, and plan to repeat the study in subsequent years.

Hearings are easily measured. The outcomes of individual bills, in this age of omnibus, is harder to track.

There are several paths for a bill to become a law: passed as a standalone bill, as a numbered amendment, or as part of an omnibus bill. Since similar language that is incorporated - especially in committee with author's amendments - isn't always identified and tracked by bill number, it is easy to lose track of which bills made it across the finish line. At this point we are not including this information in the report. We are exploring opportunities to expand the scope of the report in future years and will do so if resources allow.

# **Conclusions**

Is any of this meaningful enough to be significant? Proof of *any* bipartisanship could be framed by the majority as proof of bipartisan cooperation, but at the same time could framed by the minority party as small and insignificant. Or vice versa.

As the saying goes, what gets measured gets managed. By paying attention to the actual data - and frankly, by publishing it - we could be influencing future behavior, although there is currently no way to know in what way or by how much. It is our hope that in future years the proportion of bipartisan authorship of bills will increase, and legislators who engage in work across the aisle will be recognized by their constituents and the news media.

We hope this report will accomplish two things:

One, to give support and acknowledgement to those legislators who are working across the aisle. We see you and we thank you for work that often goes unnoticed and unappreciated. Keep it up.

Secondly, to the public: despite what you may see in the news, or on social media, or from political campaigns - not all politics is divisive. Not every legislator sees enemies on the other side of the aisle. If you look hard enough, you can see the good work that's being done behind the scenes. (And if bipartisan cooperation is something you care about, we encourage you to run for office. This work needs more champions.)

# **Best Practices**

While researching this report, we identified some best practices and opportunities we would recommend for future sessions to increase cooperation and collaboration:

- The House Veterans Committee noted in its minutes that one bill was co-presented by a member of the majority party, and a member of the minority party. Encouraging bipartisan teams to co-present bills could give rise to more bipartisan efforts.
- The Senate Taxes chair instituted a new rule pledging not to hear bills with five authors of the same party. Four of the same party would be acceptable, if space was left for an author of another party.
- The seating arrangement of committee members in the Senate mixes members by party, which encourages
  relationship building, while the parties generally occupy opposite sides of the committee tables in the House. (It
  should be noted that individual committee members in the House do have the agency to "cross the aisle" and sit
  on the opposite side, while seats in Senate committees are assigned.)

# Methodology

Bill introductions and referrals as they apply to committees, and bill authors in the individual graphs are as of adjournment on May 22, 2023.

The bill authors in the committee graphs are authorship as of the hearing date. (If an author was added or removed the same day as a hearing, we took that change as of the hearing - whether or not the floor session happened before or after the committee meeting.)

Hearings in the Rules committees were not included in the report because bill referrals to those committees operate differently than the policy and finance committees.

Some bills were counted multiple times because of multiple hearings across committees.

The graphs illustrating Senate bills will not have any bills in the 1-19% or 81-99% categories, because of the mathematical limits of 5 bill authors or less. These categories only apply to House bills.

Committees and individual legislators are presented in alphabetical order. One House member got married during the interim and is identified with her former last name in parentheses for clarity. One House member resigned during the interim prior to the publication of this report. We left her information in the dataset.

Authorship is based on information contained on the Minnesota legislative website, which is populated by information from the Revisor's office, and the House and Senate staff.

Hearings information is based on information publicly published in committee minutes, bill status spreadsheets, and individual bill information on the Minnesota Legislature website.

These numbers should be viewed as a mid-term report. Since the Minnesota legislature operates in a two-year biennium, some of what you see in this report can and will change by the end of the 93rd legislature. Bills that did not pass by 2023 adjournment are still viable until the legislature adjourns sine die in 2024.
